# From the Scholarship Committee:

Here's the perfect reason and inspiration for supporting the GFWC-WS Scholarship Fund program, and for starting early to get your applications out to the young women in your area high schools. I'd like to share with you, a letter from this year's first place winner, Evelyn Negrete.

Dear GFWC-WS Educational Scholarship donors and committees,

I am writing you this letter of gratitude to give thanks for choosing me for your scholarship. As a child of low income, awaiting this award was a constant staying up late worrying if I would be able to pursue my career goals, and thanks to you guys, I will be able to! My parents had to drop out of middle school to work in the strawberry fields so they were never given this once in a lifetime opportunity. They came to this country for one reason, so us, their children, can follow the "American Dream" and actually have an opportunity in life. This money was a very huge relief for my parents. They have encouraged me to further my education so I would not have to work in the fields as they do. They told me they will be there for me and support me, but cannot support me financially because they still have my younger brother and sister to take care of as well as themselves, so this scholarship will be a great assistance.

Having this money will not just help me achieve my goals in life, but will also benefit our community. After graduating high school, I will attend University of Washington-Bothell for a Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program, Like many universities around the country, the nursing field is a very competitive spot. In University of Washington-Bothell only 8% that apply for the program actually get admitted, which is roughly around 30 to 35 students. The nursing program is a little over four years and in those years I am required to take a quarter during my summers as well, My advisor suggested for me not to work while taking these courses because of how difficult they are. He advised me to study rather than work so I can focus on my education. So this financial assistance will be a great help! I will not have to worry about my classes being paid or not, again thank you. After I graduate University of Washington-Bothell, I will come back and work in my community to help anyone and everyone, no matter their race, color, religion, sexual preference or sexual orientation. I will help anyone that needs medical assistance no matter their financial status because I believe everyone deserves to have medical attention at their fingertips Thank you for this scholarship and I will not let you down!

# Leadership Education and Development Seminar (LEADS) APPLICATIONS NEEDED!!!!

Now is the time to be filling out those applications and submitting your LEADS nominations! **Applications are due December 15**<sup>th</sup>! We want you all thinking and talking in your local clubs now about clubwoman who would be interested in applying.

The GFWC Leadership Education and Development Seminar (LEADS) program is intended to identify GFWC members at the grassroots level who have the potential and the desire to assume leadership positions in GFWC and beyond their club. Participation in LEADS can help these members gain the capabilities, confidence and commitment necessary to pursue and achieve higher office and serve with distinction. The LEADS program is held annually on the day prior to the official opening day of the GFWC Annual Convention. It is a full day of activities, and includes breakfast and lunch.

## **Application and Selection Process**

Each state federation selects one LEADS attendee annually. It is highly recommended that each LEADS candidate:

- Demonstrates leadership capabilities at the club level as an active club president, club officer, or club project and/or committee chairman;
- Exhibits a commitment to Federation;
- Understands the GFWC mission of community service, illustrated by programs and projects in which she is or has been involved;
- Shows leadership skills, including, but not limited to, organization, responsibility, trustworthiness, enthusiasm, and flexibility;
- Exhibits an interest in and willingness to pursue higher leadership positions in Federation;
- Agrees to share information gained from participation in LEADS with others in the state;
- Understands and accepts potential expenses involved in participation;
- Has not attended a previous GFWC LEADS program.


