

Proposed Amendments to the Standing Rules:

discussion to be at Spring Convention

Finances Rule 3,c currently reads:

- 3. Expenses for Annual Convention
 - c. Expenses for the Dean of Chairmen, Endowment Trustee, Parliamentary Advisor, the six Community Service Program Chairmen, the Special Project Chairman, the five Advancement Chairmen, the Domestic Violence Chairman, the Community Improvement Program Chairman, the Arts Room Chairman, the Bylaws Chairman, the Convention/Meeting Chairman, the Registration/Election Chairman, the Federation Forest Chairman, the Resolution Chairman, the Scholarship Chairman, and the WHRC Chairman to attend the annual GFWC-WS Convention shall be paid from the treasury, in the amount not to exceed \$25.00 each, provided the direct expenses, meeting meals, room and transportation (gas and oil), are equal to or greater than this amount. Members serving in dual position shall be paid only once.

Rational: The Dean of Chairmen and the Domestic Violence Chairman were inadvertently left out of the Rule 3,c change made and adopted in April of 2018. Also, to clarify that an individual can only be paid for one position on the Board.
